MEET OUR PARTNER: Small Business Administration

At the Maine SBDC, we consider ourselves the hub of an entrepreneur or small business' journey through self-employment. Part of our success is knowing the many resources available to you -- to connect you to the resources that can help your business succeed.

This month we introduce you to ***Small Business Administration (SBA)***.

What does SBA do?

The SBA is a program of the federal government and has four main functions: access to capital (business financing), entrepreneurial development (education, information and technical assistance/training), government contracting (federal procurement), and advocacy (voice for small business).

Your Small Business Resource

The Maine District Office of the SBA is responsible for the delivery of the SBA's programs and services, which include financial assistance for new and existing businesses through guaranteed loans made by area banks and non-bank lenders, and free counseling advice and information on starting, operating or expanding a small business through the Maine SBDC, SCORE and Women's Business Center programs.

How can they help you/your business?

1. *Financing*: SBA provides a number of financial assistance programs to small businesses that have been specifically designated to meet key financing needs, including loan programs, surety bonds and equity financing. While the SBA itself does not make loans, it does guarantee loans made to small businesses by private and other institutions.
2. *Business advising*: SBA works with Maine SBDC, SCORE and WBC to provide no-cost small business advising to Maine entrepreneurs and small businesses.
3. *Information*: SBA's website is PACKED full of good information on starting and running a business. Check it out here.
4. *Resource guide*: Maine Resource Guide for Small Business (PDF download), published each year, provides vital information for business owners in one location.
